Safely launch dinghies, kayaks, or stand-up paddle boards and explore the scenic Frankland River up to Monastery Landing in the Walpole and Nornalup Inlets Marine Park.

The Nornalup Jetty has an easy-access ramp and boardwalk that take you from the parking area to the platform. There's seating and even a paddle launch chute designed especially for people with disability, making it even easier to enjoy paddling the river and soaking in the stunning scenery.




Adventure is in the air in the Southern Forests and Valleys.


Download the new Emergency WA
